Officer Acord observed numerous patrons, who did not work at the establishment, leaving it. Officer Acord entered the establishment and observed numerous open containers of alcohol on the bar in front of patrons, including a patron who had not paid. The officer advised the manager that operating past 2:00am was in violation of her licensure.

Violation of Rule 3.03 (c) Employee Records – September 5, 2015 – At approximately 9:15 pm, Baltimore City Police Department's Vice Squad responded to the establishment to investigate an assault. Investigation revealed that the assailant may have been an employee of the establishment, but the victim, a dancer at the establishment, did not want to press charges. Upon asking for a copy of the employee records to ensure that the dancer, Ms. Datija Jones, was of age to be performing at the establishment the manager on-duty produced employee records which were inaccurate. Further investigation revealed that Ms. Jones was under the age of 18 at time she was performing at the establishment.

Violation of Adult Entertainment Rule 2 – Minimum Age of Dancer – September 5, 2015 – At approximately 9:15 pm, Baltimore City Police Department's Vice Squad responded to the establishment to investigate an assault. Investigation revealed that the assailant may have been an employee of the establishment, but the victim, a dancer at the establishment, did not want to press charges. Upon asking for a copy of the employee records to ensure that the dancer, Ms. Datija Jones, was of age to be performing at the establishment the manager on-duty produced employee records

which were inaccurate. Further investigation revealed that Ms. Jones was under the age of 18 at time she was performing at the establishment.
